PhD

- A masters (honours) degree, or
- A bachelors degree with honours class I or bachelors degree with honours class II division 1, or
- Qualifications from a university or other tertiary institution deemed by the Research Studies Committee to be equivalent to the requirements set out above.

The Research Studies Committee may require an applicant to demonstrate fitness for admission to candidature by satisfactorily carrying out such work and/or sitting for such examinations as the Research Studies Committee may determine.

In exceptional circumstances, an applicant may be admitted to candidature for the degree if the applicant submits evidence of such academic and professional attainment, and demonstrates in an appropriate discipline a capacity for the research, deemed by the Research Studies Committee to be acceptable for the purpose of proceeding to the degree. Normally this will include sustained scholarly writing, which has been peer reviewed and demonstrable research skills.

Professional Doctorate

- A masters (Honours) degree, or
- A bachelors degree with Honours Class 1 or bachelors degree with Honours Class II Division 1, or
- A degree of master in an appropriate discipline or disciplines which included a major research component deemed acceptable to the Research Studies Committee for the purpose of candidature for this degree, or
- qualifications from a University or other tertiary institution or professional qualifications deemed by the Research Studies Committee to be equivalent to the requirements set out above.

Some programs may require applicants to hold substantial professional experience and/or meet professional accreditation requirements.

In exceptional circumstances, an applicant may be admitted to candidature for the degree if the applicant submits evidence of such academic and professional attainment, and demonstrates in an appropriate discipline a capacity for the research, deemed by the Research Studies Committee to be acceptable for the purpose of proceeding to the degree. Normally this will include sustained scholarly writing, which has been peer reviewed and demonstrable research skills.

M(Hons)

- A bachelors (honours) degree, or
- A bachelors degree and demonstration in an appropriate discipline or disciplines of a capacity for research deemed by the Research Studies Committee to be acceptable for the purpose of proceeding to the degree, or
- Qualifications from a university or other tertiary institution deemed by the Research Studies Committee to be equivalent to the requirements set out above.
